The B3230 road linking Ilfracombe and Muddiford will be closed from February 25th to March 29th.

Devon County Council (DCC) say the closure will run from around 200 metres from the Muddiford Inn to the entrance to Plaistow Mills Fishery.

The closure is necessary to carry out work to stabilise a collapsing road edge and retaining wall.

### **Parish Council Report**

**Report of Marwood Parish Council Meeting** 7 February 2013

Present: Cllrs Mrs S Darling, M Darling, C Spear, G Tamlyn,

C Latham, T Bigge, R May, J Glanville

In Attendance: M J Measures (Clerk to the Council) Apologies: Clr C Wallis, Cllr F J Tucker, Cllr Mrs A Davis, PCSO Kingdon

Police Report: In the absence of PCSO Kingdon the Clerk reported one crime of theft.

County/District Councillors Reports: The Clerk was asked to emphasise the Parish Forum on 20 February and from Cllr Davis' report; "staying well and warm", funding for public health, NHS Reforms, Devon Health and Wellbeing Board.

Planning: 55021 Springfield Nursery. Removal of condition 3 to allow siting of classroom for a further three years. Recommend: Approval

Finance: Balance £10.483.15 (this still includes DCC grant for footpath maintenance)

Reports from Councillors: Cllr Mrs Darling said all of Footpath I has been closed as a result of flooding and there has been some tractor damage to byway 36. Cllr Latham reported a land-slip at Hewish Lane and another on the B3230 at North Lane. Comment was made that the streams running through the Parish need dredging. The Clerk will contact the Environment Agency.

Cllr May said a proposal has now been submitted to Fullabrook CIC but there is still a major problem regarding the access road at the school.

Cllr Glanville said she was disappointed that no other Councillors, (with the exception of Cllr Mrs Darling) had attended the last meeting of the Rural Alliance especially as it was held in Marwood.

Marwood Community Hall Project: The Trustees had held a meeting prior to the Council Meeting to discuss the Business Plan Report from the Hall Management Committee. The three Trustees who are also Parish Councillors did not speak or vote on this matter at the Council Meeting.

Some Members had sent the Parish Clerk comments, as requested by Council. These include: the joint user management agreement is not in favour of the public; other Parishes have been included in the Ward when it should only be for inhabitants of Marwood; the access road is still a problem; the school should not have excusive use of the proposed hall from 07.00 to 17.00 during term-time weekdays.

Flooding: The Clerk obtained 100 sand-bags from NDC which are now held by Cllr Spear. The only problem is, they do not contain sand. The Clerk will investigate the provision of sand and salt for the highways.

The meeting closed at 8.38pm




