# MARWOOD PARISH COUNCIL Report of the COUNCIL MEETING 6 April 2017 Marwood Methodist Church Hall, Guineaford

Before the PC Meeting, a member of the public addressed the meeting regarding his and other residents concern with the amount of mud being left on local roads. He said the problem seems to have increased over the last few years. Soil is washed from neighbouring fields blocking drains and causing local flooding. A copy of the NFU Briefing on this subject had been sent to Members by the Clerk.

**Members Present:** Cllrs. C Latham, R Berry, D Chugg, S Button, A Skentelbery, C Spear, C Wallis

**Apologies:** Cllrs. Mrs S Darling, T Bigge, Cllr F Tucker. PCSO Kingdon

**In Attendance:** Cllr Mrs Davis, M J Measures, 8 members of the public.

**Disclosable Interests:** Cllrs C Latham, D Chugg, R Berry declared a personal interest on the item regarding 'mud on the road'.

**Police Report:** Burglary to workshop (power and hand tools stolen); two criminal damage; theft from motor vehicle (investigation on-going, suspect on bail).

#### **Reports from County and District Councillors:**

The two social houses in the Prixford development attracted 79 applicants and two from within the Parish are currently being interviewed. Cllr Mrs Davis reported that the new Chairman of North Devon Council is Cllr Sue Croft and the Vice-Chairman is Cllr John Moore.

#### Discussion of the matter of 'mud on the roads':

Cllr Mrs Davis circulated copies of information from Devon County Council regarding 'Farming and the Public Highway'. Members commented that in a farming area it is only to be expected, that at certain times, there will be an increase in the amount of mud on the roads but efforts are made to keep this to a minimum. A major problem is that drains are frequently blocked and not regularly cleaned. This task used to be carried out by the Parish Lengthsman but the service is no longer available, due to lack of funds. The Parish Council does carry out some drain clearing. The public were informed that DCC can be contacted direct via the website to report any problems. The Clerk read an information bulletin from the NFU (copy attached to the Minutes) which emphasised the need for all road users to drive carefully through local roads.

Cllr Mrs Davis thanked the Parish Council for their support over the last four years and hoped to be re-elected to continue to serve as County Councillor.

Six members of the public and Cllr Mrs Davis left the meeting Correspondence: Marwood Pre-school once again thanked the PC for the grant and stated that the OFSTED inspection was reported as 'good'. DCC Road Closure Notice, Windy Cross to Lee Cottages Ashford on Thursday 27 April Finance: Invoices passed for payment: £176.77 (DALC Annual Affiliation Fee); £1458.00 (Defib Stores Ltd. for the purchase of a defibrillator to be installed in the BT Kiosk in Muddiford.) The cost is met by a grant from Fullabrook CIC and a grant from North Devon Council (Cllr. Tucker's Local Councillor Grant). The Clerk reported the balance at 6 April as £6001.48 (this includes P3 funds and Transparency Code funds). The Clerk is in the process of preparing the end of year Financial Statement and will present the Annual Finance and Governance Statements and Financial Risk Assessment to the meeting in May. Claire Hummerston to be appointed as the Internal Auditor, as last year.

**Planning Matters:** 62715 – 2 Whitefield Villas Muddiford. Extension to dwelling (Amended design to that approved by planning application 60918.) Recommend: Approval 62839 – 1 Hewish Cottages Muddiford. Partially retrospective for the erection of a replacement garage/ storage building together with ancillary works. Recommend: Approval

Two members of the public left the meeting Cllr Chugg said he understood a North Devon Homes property at Whitehall Cottages has been sold on the open market. He asked the Clerk to find out if this is true. Contd.>

Contd. > Provision of a Defibrillator: BT has confirmed the transfer and decommissioning of the kiosk and that the invoice has now been received for payment of the defibrillator (see above). Muddiford Inn Group will be responsible for the installation, training, servicing, management and reporting of the defibrillator.

Reports from Councillors: Cllr Wallis reported that the County Rights of Way Officer inspected footpath/bridleway 33 and has closed it for three weeks as a result of serious erosion. It may be necessary to close it for a longer period. He reported that the work will involve considerable cost and local farmers who use the footpath/bridleway and the PC will be asked to assist with funding and materials. The Officer will arrange some funding through DCC.

## Simple Seaonal Cooking - Rhubarb Fool - Makes 4



350gm fresh rhubarb chopped into 2-3cm pieces 50gm caster sugar

1 orange, zest only 150ml double cream

1 egg white

3 crushed digestive or oat biscuits

- 1. Cook rhubarb, zest and sugar gently for 10minutes until rhubarb is soft. Drain rhubarb pieces and set aside to cool. Poor juices back into pan, simmer for 5 minutes to thicken slightly and then allow to cool.
- 2. Whip double cream and egg whites separately and then fold together.
- 3. Fold through rhubarb pieces and divide between 4 glasses. Leave to chill for at least 2 hours.
- 4. Just before serving, drizzle with reserved syrup and top with the crumbled biscuit.
