Alun Dobson headteacher at Marwood School writes...It has been a busy start to the school year operating mostly in the way we were used to before Covid19. There are still precautions in place; extra cleaning, handwashing, ventilation, not having groups of parents onsite at the start and end of the day and staff doing LFD tests. However children can play and eat together again, we have assemblies, afterschool clubs and music tuition back on. We are also looking forward to taking children offsite to give them exciting experiences again. Our year 3/4 children have started weekly swimming and visited Kents Cavern in Torquay to learn about rocks and people living in the Stone Age. Our oldest children have a two-night residential in October and their activities include, climbing, high ropes, surfing and the Ultimate Adventure Course. We have invested in the Oxford University Press reading resources in a renewal of our approach to children learning to read. Staff have worked amazingly to sort through the library and make sure that children have access to the quality and age/stage-appropriate texts they need.

Volunteers – staff and I would really like to involve members of the community in the school. It could be to hear children read and share stories, help with gardening and improving our grounds, assisting with games at lunchtime or letting us know of your life stories/experiences you could share. A REMINDER ABOUT OUR RECYCLING!

Green or black recycling box - please wash, squash and pop the cap back on plastic bottles

- Small waste electrical and electronic equipment (WEEE) such as kettles, toasters and mobile phones. Loose cables (mobile phone and computer cables) can also be recycled. **All items should be no larger than a standard-sized carrier bag**
- Mixed plastics including yoghurt pots, margarine tubs, plastic bottles and food trays, apart from black plastic which is not recyclable at the moment - **squashed and lids replaced where possible**
- Food tins and drink cans
- Aluminium foil
- Aerosol cans

Please ensure all bottles, tins and cans are rinsed well and, to help save space on our vehicles, please also squash your plastics and cans where possible.

Washing baskets, water carriers or beer kegs CAN NOT be put in your recycling box, as these will damage our recycling machinery.

Please do not place hard/rigid plastics (which do not give easily when squeezed) such as buckets, toys or storage boxes/crates in your recycling box, as these will also damage our recycling machinery.

Unfortunately, we are not able to take black plastic products, plant pots, cling film, tetra packs and packaging film. This includes cellophane, sweet wrappers and crisp packets. We are also unable to take light bulbs because we don't have a market for them at present.
